**Professor Anastasia Nesvetailova** is Director of City Political Economy Research Centre. She has been appointed as member of the economic, an anti-austerity team with the aim of drafting an alternative economic program to post crisis austerity. She is a research specialist in International Political Economy. Her areas of interest cover finance and financial crises, globalisation and governance and her current research focuses on the themes of global financial fragility and crises, the formation of financial and monetary policies and the proprocess of capitalist evolution in Russia and other FSU countries. She currently teaches at the School of Social Sciences of the City University in London at undergraduate and PG level.

She is a former lecturer at the Centre for Global Political Economy of the University of Sussex. **Professor Ronen Palan** is an expert on off-shore finance, he is a Professor in International Political Economy at the University of Birmingham. His areas of research cover international political economy, evolutionary political economy, state theory, sociology and human geography. He has a particular interest in state theory and in the changing nature of the state and modes of governance in the contemporary globalised economy, not only in the case of powerful states but also in the smallest states in the world, the tax havens. His publications concern the changing nature of the state in the age of globalization: *Tax Havens: How Globalization Really Works* (Cornell University Press, 2010), *Paradis Fiscaux* (La Découverte, 2006), *The Imagined Economies of Globalisation* (Sage, 2004). He is the founding editor and current member of the board of trustees of the *Review of International Political Economy* and a visiting professor at several Universities including the Central European University, Budapest, Hebrew University, Jerusalem, York University, Toronto, ULB, Brussels, CERIS, Brussels, CEPREMAP, Paris.
